

WILDFIRE ACTIVITY IN THE HIGHLANDS AND ISLANDS


- > 382 incidents
- > 618 appliance mobilisations
- > 2500 crew members (incl multiple attendances)
- ➤ In excess of 8600 personnel hours
- > Total operational costs circa £250k
- > Largest single event Achmore near Kyle
 - 39 Appliance mobilisations over a five day period
 - 169 crew members
 - 11sq Km damaged (incl heathland and trees)
 - Largest single incident in eight years

- > Resilience maintaining operational cover
- > Direct and indirect appliance movements
- > Impact on revenue budgets
- > Operational staff and officers
- ➤ Land Managers and support staff

- ➤ Re-energised Scottish Wildfire Forum and partnership working with other UK wide Fora
- ➤ Re-defined Strategic Aims and Action Plan
- ➤ Implement the new Scottish Government sponsored Wildfire Operational Guidance
 - Providing appropriate wildfire training for all personnel
 - Progression of Wildfire Groups
 - Promoting Specialist Wildfire Teams

- ➤ Fire and Rescue, Partner Agency and Land Managers resource management planning
- > Training, including specialist skills and equipment
- > Prevention and Protection planning
 - Fire awareness, education and prevention
 - Fire danger rating and early warning systems
 - Effective targeted response
