

Ignite: 1 day An Introduction to Woodfuel – Farms and Estates

This Ignite one-day seminar is designed to introduce farms and estates with an interest in biomass as suppliers and end users to the opportunities provided by woodfuel.

The seminar introduces the concept of farm and estate grown wood as renewable energy and looks in more detail at the opportunities afforded by woodfuel including woodfuel heating technologies and woodfuel processing and handling equipment. The seminar also involves a visit to a working woodfuel boiler system.
